Three Fury U18's Sign on the Dotted Line for 09

The Chicago Fury is proud to announce that three members of the Major Midget Team have signed Tender Contracts to play in the North American Hockey League (NAHL Tier II Jr. A) next season.

Rookie forward Bobby Murphy has signed with the Topeka Roadrunners in the NAHL South Division. Topeka currently sits tied for first place overall in the NAHL. The Anchorage, AK native is not big in size but has top end skill to compete at the next level. "We are proud of Bobby and his choice to play for Topeka. They have a great program, great facilities, and have a solid record of winning and moving kids to Division I college hockey" says Fury Head Coach Nick Pollos.

Adding to the list of signees are first year D-Man Tyler Wilson and recently added Forward Justin Erhart, who have signed with the Bismarck Bobcats in the NAHL Central Division. The Bobcats lead the NAHL Central with the best winning percentage. Wilson, the 6'3" / 185 LB left shot D-man from Alaska, brings a strong physical presence and big shot to the Bobcats Blue line. "Tyler has come a long way this year" said Fury Head Coach Nick Pollos. "He works hard and plays with an edge. The Bobcats are getting a kid with great upside and passion for the game." The Bobcats also signed Fury U18 forward Justin Erhart to a Tender Contract. The Minnesota native recently joined the team and has made an immediate impact on his new teammates. Justin will bring a strong skating stride, solid hockey sense and creative puck skills to the Bobcats next year. "He has a great skill set and is a top character kid" says Fury Head Coach Nick Pollos. "He has fit in right away with his new teammates."

All three players are still eligible for the USHL Draft in May however their playing rights in the NAHL are now owned by the clubs which they signed with. "Our club is committed to helping players advance to the next levels of hockey" says Fury Head Coach Nick Pollos. "We are very excited for these young men in their choices thus far and we expect other announcements will follow regarding more player advancement."
